



REDMOND DOWNTOWN PARK - CONCEPT B

Concept B is inspired by the flat layers of peat that were left behind centuries ago as the bogs evolved into peat. This is expressed in a classic rectilinear pattern that reflects the urban nature of the downtown setting.

Great Lawn/Meadow: The meadow is a rectangular space raised two feet above the surrounding plaza. It is edged on two sides by steps which double as seating for performances. On the north edge it is bordered by a stone seat wall, and on the south edge is a wide wooden platform suitable for seating.

Trees/ Landscape: Many trees on the site are arranged in regular allee or bosque patterns, creating inviting tree-covered spaces to walk or sit. In other locations, such as “The Sanctuary” and along the south and east edges, beautiful flowering cherry trees are arranged in a more informal pattern.


Pavilion/ Public Art: The large pavilion is inspired by the topographical and geological underpinnings of Redmond. The innovative and dynamic pavilion has a horizon-like roof, and undulating topographical ceiling and is closely integrated with a sculpted water feature. Projection of light and color from below onto the veil and the undulating ceiling surface transform the pavilion into a glowing beacon.

Water Feature: A translucent veil carries water from the roof of the pavilion to the base in an ephemeral curtain of light, pattern and texture. It cascades across a pool to the Great Lawn.


Seating Opportunities:

Concept B features the following places to sit and relax:

- The wood boardwalk along the south edge of the Great Lawn
- Steps on each end of the Great Lawn
- Stone seat walls under the trees along the north and south edges, on the north side of the Great Lawn, and adjacent to the pond/pavilion
- Moveable tables and chairs on the boardwalk, and in the dining area next to the Stone House
