# REDMOND DOWNTOWN PARK - CONCEPT C

Concept C is inspired by the successional landscape, populated by changing pioneer tree and plant species. Successional landscapes embody an in-between state, somewhere between the domesticated grid and the organic. This is expressed in the park with arcs of movement that curve gently from street to plaza to meadow and bosque, guiding people around and through the park.

**Great Lawn/Meadow:** The Meadow is a large grassy space at ground level. It is edged on the southwest by a white granite patio.

**Trees/ Landscape:** Trees are placed in an allee along the north edge, and in long arcs that direct movement through the center of the site. They are clustered more informally in the dining corner along the south edge.


**Pavilion/ Public Art:** The pavilion is inspired by the maple tree and its samaras, or seed pods. The pavilion manifests as a central trunk that emerges dynamically out of the ground, reaching outward to form a covering canopy. The walls of the central structure are intimate and inhabitable, with curves, bends and shape for the human body to nestle within. The walls of the central form will be warmed either through solar voltaic or geothermal energy, creating a comfortable, cozy place on rainy or winter days. On the opposite corner of the park, a series of smaller covered structure with folded wings are scattered. When inhabited, each structure lights up creating a field of color and energy.

**Water Feature:** A portion of the plaza is floodable and has water jets for fun summer play. It is edged on two sides with an arc of raised white granite, which provides a great place to warm up, or to watch children at play.


**Seating Opportunities:**

Concept C features the following places to sit and relax:

- The white granite patios that forms a raised arc next to the water feature
- Stacked wood seating walls under the trees in the central arc and in the Meadow
- Sculptural seating in the dining area next to the Stone House
- Moveable tables and chairs along the east edge of the park
