

Two-way Street Conversion



This project will upgrade utilities and convert both Redmond Way and Cleveland Street to two-way traffic, creating better access for residents and businesses.

- Location:** Redmond Way and Cleveland St from 160th Ave NE to Avondale Way
- Project Phase:** Under construction
- Estimated Timeline:** Design 2013-2015, Construction June 2016 through end of 2017


The conversion will make Downtown easier to navigate and more connected, whether you are driving, walking, biking, or taking transit. Cleveland Street is designated as Redmond's signature "main street" while Redmond Way will carry the majority of traffic as the main arterial through Downtown. This project is the completion of the planned transportation grid in Downtown, which included the sequencing of six major roadway and utility infrastructure projects over the past six years.

The following work will occur at the eleven intersections:


- Replacing old utilities (water, storm)
- New traffic signals, lighting, and sidewalks
- Undergrounding of overhead power and communications
- Paving and landscaping
- New plazas near Anderson Park

Work between the intersections includes:

- Reconfiguring lanes
- Updating street signs
- Remaining sidewalk and parking improvements between intersections will be constructed later as private development occurs




Maintaining access to businesses and adjacent properties will be a priority during the project.

Total:	\$27.0 million
City General & Utility Funds:	\$ 2.8 million
Other Funding:	\$24.2 million

Recent Activities:

- Coordinating weekly with adjacent developers and utility companies on construction activities, schedules, and access.
- New signal and light poles have been going up along with associated electrical work.
- Work continued at the new intersections on Redmond Way at 168th and Avondale Way.
- Cleveland Street opened to two-way traffic on Friday, September 8, ahead of the original schedule. Traffic Operations continues to monitor and adjust signal timing.
- Two new permanent message signs are active on Redmond Way coming into Downtown. Please watch for traffic updates.

What's Happening Next:

- Project impacts are constantly changing. Find updates and the option to sign up for project and construction news below.
- Redmond Way is planned to convert to two-way traffic in October, which will finish the Downtown two-way conversion, put traffic into final configuration, and re-establish street parking on the south side of Redmond Way.
- Project work will continue through the end of the year and includes opening 168th Ave NE north of Redmond Way, as well as finishing plazas, landscaping, sidewalks, and clean up.

Neighborhood Impacts:

- Construction impacts mostly occur during the daytime and may include lane closures and some construction noise. However, some final night or Saturday work may occur if the project experiences weather delays or other impacts.
- Traffic impacts from construction activities include the temporary closure of the south end of 168th Ave NE during construction.
- Private development projects will continue.
- Please stay aware of and follow changing pedestrian access routes through the construction zones.
