About the Two-way Street Conversion Project

The Two-way Street Conversion project, which converts both Redmond Way and Cleveland Street to two-way traffic, is the completion of the planned transportation grid in Downtown Redmond. Whether you choose to drive, walk, bicycle or take transit, the neighborhood has many options:

- **Cleveland Street** is now Redmond's signature "main street" with wide sidewalks inviting pedestrians and outdoor dining
- **Redmond Way** will carry the majority of traffic as the main arterial throughout downtown
- **Bear Creek Parkway** and **SR520** offer options for drivers who want to bypass Downtown
- **Redmond Central Connector** urban trail provides a beautiful and safe option for bicyclists and pedestrians

These options, paired with previous street improvements at 161 Ave NE and 164 Ave NE, complete the planned Downtown transportation infrastructure.
