


Light Rail




Redmond is preparing for the arrival of four light rail stations: Overlake Village and Redmond Technology stations in 2023, and the Southeast Redmond and Downtown Redmond stations in 2024. Extension of Sound Transit's light rail into Redmond will provide fast, frequent and reliable connections around town, Bellevue, Seattle and to the rest of the region.

The City's Role with Light Rail

Although this is a Sound Transit project, the City of Redmond is working together with them to share information on construction, traffic impacts, and other issues that may affect our community or nearby homes, businesses, or properties during design and construction of light rail.

Overlake (Two Stations)

Construction is underway at the Overlake Village and Redmond Technology Station (previously Overlake Transit Center) stations. Both are scheduled to open in 2023.

Recent Activities

- All drilled shafts for the light rail guideway are completed. The contractor continues to pour concrete for the columns and caps. The contractor's also setting girders, and recently placed the girders over the SR520 148th Ave NE overpass during a nighttime closure.
- Soil nail wall installation is complete between Overlake Village and Redmond Technology Station. Work is now progressing on the track and sound wall concrete pours.
- A tower crane has been erected and the Redmond Technology Station construction is underway including the parking garage.
- Construction of a regional stormwater vault at the Overlake Village Station is complete and has been fully operational since May 1st, 2018.

Downtown Redmond (Two Stations)

Sound Transit is preparing to select a design-build team to finish design and construct the 3.4-mile light rail extension from Overlake to Downtown Redmond. The extension has two stations: one in Southeast Redmond in Marymoor Village, and one in Downtown adjacent to the Redmond Central Connector, at 166th. Both are scheduled to open in 2024.

Recent Activities

- In November 2017 Sound Transit hosted an open house to share updates on the design and to gather input on community priorities for station design and amenities priorities.
- In January 2018 the Puget Sound Regional Council awarded \$2.3 million to King County to extend the East Lake Sammamish Trail through the SR 520 interchange to connect with the Redmond Central Connector. The City is a financial partner in the project and both the City and Sound Transit strongly supported the grant application. The trail extension is possible because the light rail project will elevate SR 520 ramps that currently preclude the crossing.
- The Sound Transit board has authorized a series of property acquisitions for the Downtown extension. Additional authorizations will continue during 2018.
- City staff are continuing to work closely with Sound Transit to finalize the design-build procurement documents – including for stations, traffic, utilities, trails, and other disciplines – that are expected to be issued in fall 2018.
