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**Meeting Summary**

Chair Hank Myers called the meeting to order.

**CPR/AED Program Report**

Deputy Fire Chief Jim Duren presented information on the CPR/AED Program:

- educational component to response functions;
- Seattle-King County Medic One;
- objectives;
- coronary perfusion;
- the problem;
- Redmond Medic One Cardiac Arrest Initiative;
- Redmond Medic One LifeNet Data Map;
- Redmond Medic One Cardiac Arrest Committee;
- PhysioControl;
- Post Incident Review;
- CPR Summary Report;
- Code Drills and Training;
- the solution; and

- Letter from King County.

Deputy Duren presented information on best practices for improving the hands-on compression ratio, an example of a LifeNet CPR report, and shared a public comment received complimenting Redmond Medic One on an excellent response to a cardiac arrest alarm.

General discussion ensued regarding Redmond Medic One CPR/AED procedures.

### **Drug Take-Back Program Report**

Police Commander Kristin Wilson reported on the Drug Take-Back Program:

- a second event was held, which was integrated with the city recycling event;
- 140 pounds of drugs were turned in to the City at this event, and subsequently turned in to the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA); and
- the Police Department plans to continue to offer these events.

General discussion ensued regarding staffing of the events and contents of items collected.

### **Duvall/Carnation Contract Amendment**

Commander Wilson presented information on the Duvall/Carnation Contract Amendment:

- an addendum is to be added to the current dispatch contract;
- Redmond currently provides records entry administrative support for Duvall and Carnation, and will add to those duties; and
- the amendment will be added to the current contract as an addendum (for 2011-2012), and then incorporated into future contracts.

General discussion ensued regarding the costs for the added services, how these costs will be calculated, and advantages to information sharing between the cities.

MOTION: Committee Member Carson recommended proceeding with consideration of the item at the next regular Council meeting, under the consent agenda. The motion was seconded by Committee Member Stilin.

VOTE: The motion passed without objection.

### **Traffic Safety Camera Program**

Police Commander Shari Shovlin reported on the Traffic Safety Camera Program:

- background:
  - September 2010 – Council approved a 12-month pilot program (with a 30-day warning period at the outset);
  - February 1, 2011 – 30-Day warning period began;
  - Police Department staff obtained training and worked on technical issues with the vendor;

- the program:
  - operational since February 1, 2011;
  - information available on the City's Traffic Camera FAQ website (continually updated);
  - public education activities include:
    - responding to community requests for information;
    - media interviews;
    - ongoing community presentations;
  - public outreach efforts will continue throughout pilot project phase;
- report on the first three months (30-day warning period, and two months of infraction issuance);
  - number of violations at each monitored intersection and school zone by month;
  - total number of violations for March and April;
  - breakdown of the two types of violations; red light running and right turn on red;
  - number of rejected violations;
  - comparison of number of reported collisions at the camera intersections for the period January 1 through April 30, 2010, and 2011, and
  - number of reported rear end collisions at traffic safety camera intersections.

General discussion ensued regarding the cameras and violations at Einstein Elementary School, general review of how the cameras work, positive feedback for cameras, requests for additional data to be captured (traffic flow, criteria for non-issuance of an infraction, number of infractions challenged and how many prevail in court), records retention of data collected, and whether a motorist's record is searched when processing a red light camera infraction (it is not).
