Meeting Summary

Chair Hank Myers called the meeting to order.

Tech Support and Crime Trends in Urbanized Areas

Police Commander Kristi Wilson reported on Tech Support and Crime Trends in Urbanized Areas:

- with increased density there has been no spike in crime;
- typical crimes for the upcoming season:
 - car prowls;
 - burglaries;
- Redmond Police share information with other local jurisdictions/crime analysts; regarding county trends; receive intelligence on “what’s coming”.

General discussion ensued regarding holiday shopping car prowls/burglaries and increased community education opportunities thereto; public education regarding 911 calls – call in suspicious behavior, it may be the tip Police needs; education opportunities during the upcoming Redmond Lights celebration; and possible expansion of the text-a-tip program.

Five-Year Capital Plan – Police and Fire Departments

Commander Wilson and Fire Chief Kevin Donnelly updated the Committee on possible projects for the Capital Plan; topics discussed included:

- Public Safety Building (roof);
- CAD/RMS replacement for Police Department (PD), or PD and Fire Department; 2014;

- possible future multi-use facility in Overlake; and
- Fire – no items for the Five-Year Capital Plan; possible items for Seven-Year Capital Plan (stations 11/12; coverage for Overlake growth); must complete Strategic Plan (2012).

General discussion ensued regarding new facilities and service coverage for future growth in the Overlake area.

Fire District No. 34 Service Plan

Chief Donnelley updated the Committee on the Fire District No. 34 Service Plan; changes to the plan and budget will be necessary due to the recent annexation of certain areas currently covered by Kirkland. General discussion ensued regarding the changes. Amendment to the contract with FD34 will be forthcoming to the full Council for approval.

Revenues of Traffic Safety Cameras Program *(added at the time of the meeting)*

A general discussion was held regarding possible revenues generated from the Traffic Safety Cameras program and Public Safety programs for funding should there be revenues left over after Court Fees have been paid in full. Topics discussed included: school zone cameras, traffic safety priorities, signs that measure and display current speeds, calibration of speed controls and intersection design.
