Committee Chair David Carson opened the meeting, reviewed the agenda items, and noted Council members in attendance.

Fire Station No. 11 Fuel Tank Removal

Ms. Malisa Files, Deputy Finance Director, provided a report regarding the decommissioning of fuel tanks at Fire Station No. 11. She reported the tanks need to be removed from the ground, overviewed the components of the removal, and funding to accomplish the work. No funds were budgeted in the capital budget for this project and, therefore, a budget adjustment will need to be made.

Mr. Eric Dawson, Senior Construction Engineer, advised that construction will begin this summer for the project.

King County EMS Levy Measure

Police Chief Ron Gibson and representatives from King County provided a report to the members of the Committee regarding the ballot renewal of the King County EMS Levy. The levy will expire at year-end, and without renewal, Advanced Life Support provision will fall to the local jurisdictions. In order to place the levy on the ballot, all cities will need to pass a resolution in support of the ballot measure. The EMS system, a regional approach to the delivery of services, was discussed. A task force has been created at the county level and has provided a recommendation regarding the levy. A resolution will be put forward for Council consideration at the March 19, 2013, regular Council meeting.

King County Investigative Response Team Interlocal Agreement

Police Chief Gibson reported that the City currently assigns two officers to the response team group. The Interlocal Agreement allows the use of a multi-agency task force in shooting incidents. The agreement will come forward for Council consideration at the March 19, 2013, regular meeting.

Committee Work Plan Revisited

Members of the committee discussed the work plan. Staff noted that the REDCOM/NORCOM study will come forward at the March meeting for discussion. Committee Chair Carson asked that the work plan be brought forward for Council ratification at the March 5, 2013, regular meeting.
