5 4:30	Howard Hillinger called the meeting to order and welcomed CAC members and attendees.	CAC Co-Chair

10 4:40	Items from the Audience Mahesh Bogadi spoke about his concerns with asphalt smells, dust, and noise. There was also discussion of the possibility of roundabouts on 188 th Ave NE. Discussion with CAC members ensued on these topics.	CAC Co-Chair
30 4:50	Debrief Open House - What did CAC members and staff hear or observe? - What worked about the open house? - What can we improve for next time? - What other methods might we use to connect with community? Staff reported light attendance spread over the 90 minutes, and high-quality comments. In response to public comments about transportation, the CAC discussed advancing the future light rail station park & ride, optimizing flows along Redmond Way, and making use of existing pathways. There was also discussion about advancing park amenities more quickly. The CAC discussed additional communication opportunities, such as posting notice at transit areas, getting onto HOA email/web groups, using business contacts, using social media, and offering incentives. Jeff Churchill described the annual plan amendment (docketing) process and noted that the Southeast Redmond Neighborhood Plan update is already part of the docket. In that context, Kim Dietz noted that it is likely that the CAC would be asked to consider specific land use or zoning changes requested by others as part of the neighborhood plan update.
