



## **Pedestrian/Bicycle Advisory Committee (PBAC) October 8, 2007 – Meeting Summary**

### **1. Downtown Bike Racks**

Peter Dane presented the work he has done preparing for a larger implementation of the Bike-Bike Racks in Downtown Redmond. His presentation included the following information:

- Inventory of existing racks, many of which were found to be not very usable based on either their design and/or location.
- Potential installation locations – some would be installed on existing sidewalk and some would need a small concrete pad poured.
- Staff plans to have more racks installed during 2008

Committee comments included:

- The racks are another way for the City to make a statement as a bicycle friendly community
- Keep moving on this project
- Could we use pervious concrete?
- How about providing covered bike parking in some locations?

### **2. Striping: Proposed 2008 projects (Bicycle Program funding)**

Committee was supportive of marking locations where cyclists should stop to trigger traffic signals and adding bike lanes on 150<sup>th</sup> Ave NE from NE 40<sup>th</sup> St to NE 51<sup>st</sup> St. The committee did identify a few locations where cyclists have had trouble being picked up by the signal loops – Avondale Rd southbound left to NE 95<sup>th</sup> St and NE 116<sup>th</sup> St westbound at Willows Rd. – *Since the meeting both of these locations have been tested by Traffic Operations Staff. A report will be sent to the Committee regarding this issue.*

### **3. Sidewalk Program**

Staff presented a six-year list of sidewalk projects to the Committee. The Committee requested that this list be provided to Parks staff and the Parks and Trails Commission.

### **4. Other Business**

- Committee asked about the status of the project to signalize the 104<sup>th</sup> and 166<sup>th</sup> intersection – *Staff has requested that the project manager attend the January 2008 PBAC meeting.*
- Committee asked about interest in the Idle Free City – *This information was passed on to our public information and safety coordinator who is working on this issue.*
