

Have you ever circled the block trying to find that elusive parking space in Downtown Redmond? As Downtown continues to evolve as a vibrant urban center with opportunities to shop, live, work and play, the demand for a finite amount of on-street parking will continue to be high. To help increase access to Downtown, Redmond is implementing time-limits for approximately 300 on-street parking spaces during weekdays.



What are the changes to Redmond's on-street parking?

The majority of downtown on-street parking will be limited to a maximum of 2-hours, with some exceptions including 1-hour or 15-minute load/unload designations. Additionally, a limited number of permits will be available for purchase for a paid all-day parking option. Time-limits will be in effect from 9:00am to 5:00pm Monday through Friday, excluding holidays.

What streets will be affected by the program?

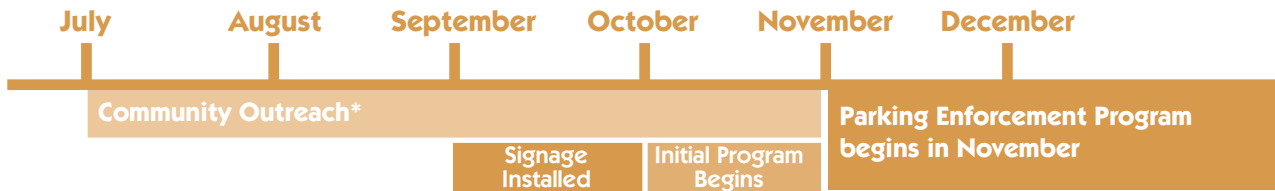
The affected area is shown on the map and bounded roughly by NE 90th St., Cleveland St., 164th Ave. NE, and the Sammamish River.

What do I do if I want to park for more than 2 hours?

A limited number of paid parking permits, allowing all-day parking, are available for sale on a monthly basis. Permits are \$50 per month and can be purchased with a credit card or debit card. Permits must be purchased by the 15th of the month to guarantee receipt of the permit by the first of the following month. To purchase a parking permit contact **Diamond Parking**, 9am - 5pm M-F at 425-556-2433 ext.1 or purchase online at diamondparking.com/monthlyparking.

What is the penalty of exceeding the parking time limit?

Beginning in November, parking time limits will be actively enforced. Diamond Parking, Redmond's contracted parking enforcement agency, will issue tickets to vehicles exceeding the maximum parking time.

What resources are available for me?

R-TRIP, the Redmond Trip Resource & Incentive Program, provides assistance to Redmond residents and employees for choosing alternatives to driving alone. The program promotes biking, walking, sharing the ride, riding the bus, working from home or combining errands. Some of the resources available to you through R-TRIP and the City of Redmond include:

- » \$300 vanpool subsidy
- » Transit and bike route map
- » Bike racks throughout Downtown Redmond
