- Staff shared an update on the former Silver Cloud Inn, which is slated to convert to permanent supportive housing for individuals experiencing homelessness by the end of the year. This facility which is owned by King County is temporarily housing refugees. Currently they are Afghan refugees, but they expect to house Ukrainian families as well. The City of Redmond is coordinating with King County, International Rescue Committee (IRC), and a few non-profit partners to host a small welcoming event. Staff will send more information about this site.
