APPROXIMATE FUNDING AVAILABLE

In 2019-2020 the City of Redmond allocated approximately \$1.27 million per year across 64 programs with awards ranging from \$3,605 to \$75,000. This was a 12% increase over the previous funding cycle. In 2017, there was an increase of 26% over the previous cycle due to Council's adjustment of the [per capita funding formula](#). Prior cycle increases averaged around 10%. The City does not currently anticipate a significant increase in available General Fund or CDBG dollars for 2021-2022.

APPLICATION ASSISTANCE

The Human Services Commission is excited to welcome new applicants to the process. If this is the first time that you are applying, we highly recommend reaching out to City of Redmond staff. Staff are available and happy to help with any questions related to the City's process and/or answer questions you may have about the content of the application. Though funding is limited, we do encourage all applicants to submit funding requests that will fully support the services proposed. APPLICATION REVIEW PROCESS

Applications will be reviewed by the City of Redmond Human Services Commission, a 7-member volunteer board appointed by the Mayor and approved by the City Council. Commission recommendations are expected by September with consideration by City Council planned for October. Final allocation amounts will be approved and adopted as part of the overall City budget. City of Redmond staff will notify agencies of final allocations following City Council approval, which is expected by early December. Awarded funds will be available January 1, 2021, which is the start of the fiscal and program year.
