Periodic Review of the Comprehensive Plan is required by the Growth Management Act (GMA) every 8 years



For King County and all the cities in King County, the periodic review must be completed by June 30, 2024

RCW 36.70A.140 requires that cities establish a public participation program that informs the public about:

- The tentative schedule for the periodic update
- The scope of the update
- Communication methods and timing
- When to comment
- When legislative action on the update is proposed (tentative)



## Phase 1 (Completed by end of 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter 2022)

- Economic vitality and COVID-19 recovery;
- Housing affordability;
- Growth allocations; and
- Transportation decisions and investments.

## Public comments will be documented and summarized with use of the following:

- Public comment matrices - document comments on draft element updates and draft regulations
- Survey records, reports, and databases
- Issues matrices - for the purpose of public hearings
- Consultant supported methods:
  - Digital engagement tools, including digital lobby
  - Modeling /crowdsourced input on land use scenarios.



- Partner with trusted community partners and organizations
- Increase accessibility by having events and information accessible in community gathering places and times throughout the project.
- Inclusion services to support participation of individuals with disabilities and those in need of accommodations
- Provide a variety of in-person and on-line venues for gathering input (with creative solutions if the 'Stay at Home' order persists).

- Use of “Plain Language”.
- Most project information, Committee recruitment, and outreach materials for events, etc., will be posted online in HTML format to enable online translation services
- City’s websites, [redmond.gov](http://redmond.gov) and [LetsConnectRedmond.com](http://LetsConnectRedmond.com), have automated Google translation functionality.
