

Concealed Pistol Licenses (CPL)

Who is eligible for a CPL?

Applicants must be City of Redmond residents or out-of-state residents. Residents of other jurisdictions, including those who live in unincorporated Redmond, must apply at their local jurisdiction or for unincorporated Redmond residents, at the King County Sheriff's Office. You may check to see if your address is within Redmond city limits [HERE](#). Please verify that your address is within Redmond city limits prior to submitting your application or obtaining fingerprints from a third party vendor. The Redmond Police Department is not responsible for third party fingerprinting fees.

Any applicant convicted of a felony cannot have a permit unless their rights have been restored by the appropriate court. Other conditions that may prevent the ability to obtain a CPL are listed in [RCW 9.41.070](#).

How to apply for, renew or replace a CPL:

Reminder: in-person applications are not being accepted at this time.

Original CPL: As part of the new process, when applying for an Original CPL you will be required to obtain a fingerprint card from a third party vendor of your choice. Although you are not required to use them, the Redmond Police Department has had success with fingerprints taken by [Bellevue Fingerprinting Services](#). Bellevue Fingerprinting Services will submit your fingerprint card on your behalf. Should you choose to use a different vendor, you will need to bring your fingerprint card to the Redmond Police Department Records Unit during normal business hours. An appointment may be required.

CPL renewals: You may not apply until 90 days prior to the expiration date shown on your current CPL.

CPL late renewals: Applications will be accepted up to 90 days after the expiration date shown on the current CPL.

CPLs more than 90 days expired are no longer valid; you must apply for an original. In the case of a lost or damaged CPL, the replacement fee is \$10 and will hold the original expiration date. You may apply for a replacement regardless of where your CPL was originally issued.

What to bring:

Applicants must provide one of the following state issued photo identification:

- A current driver's license
- A current Washington state identification card
- Equivalent out of state identification

When will I receive my permit?

In accordance with [RCW 9.41.070](#), a CPL will be issued to an eligible person residing in this state within 30 days after the submission of an application. If the applicant does not have a valid Washington state

driver's license or Washington state identification card or has not been a resident of Washington for the previous consecutive ninety days, the CPL will be issued within 60 days after the submission of an application.

Fees:

- Original CPL: \$45.75
- Renewal CPL: \$32
- Late Renewal CPL: \$42
- Replacement CPL: \$10

For credit card transactions, a nominal credit card transaction fee and an on-line convenience fee will be charged for each transaction. These charges are non-refundable and will be visible prior to transaction completion. Credit card transaction services are provided by a third party vendor and the Redmond Police Department only collects fees in accordance with the Washington State statute. In accordance with [RCW 9.41.070\(5\)](#), [RCW 9.41.070\(6\)](#) and [RCW 9.41.070\(7\)](#), fees associated with applying for a CPL are non-refundable. In the event that you cancel your application, do not pick-up your license, or if you are found to be ineligible to lawfully possess a CPL/firearm, you will not receive a refund.
