

Environmental Sustainability Advisory Committee Overview

Purpose and Role of the Committee

- Advise staff on relevant climate and sustainability initiatives in alignment with the Environmental Sustainability Action Plan (ESAP).
- Receive updates from staff on implementation and results of City sustainability policies and programs.
- Coordinate, communicate, and encourage public involvement regarding key sustainability initiatives.
- Inform the periodic refresh of the ESAP.
- Enhance sustainability practices within the Redmond community and support ESAP implementation in alignment with City goals and priorities.



Structure

- 14 members - 11 voting and 3 non-voting
 - 2 from general populous
 - 2 with professional sustainability expertise (professional or education)
 - 1 senior (55 or older)
 - 1 youth (16-21)
 - 2 business community members (1 small business)
 - 1 representing construction/developer
 - 1 representing educational community
 - 1 representative from community-based organization
 - 3 non-voting members represent Waste Management, PSE, & CWA
- Members must live or work within the City of Redmond city limits
- Members will serve 2-year terms. Initial members will be randomly assigned staggered 2- or 3-year terms at the launch of the ESAC
- Bi-monthly meetings
