**Subject:** **Transportation Master Plan Update: Vision, Principles, and Strategies**

---

### **PURPOSE**

Staff will present information on the following elements of the Transportation Master Plan (TMP) Update:

- Vision, principles, and strategies
- Draft policy considerations
- Fall 2020 public outreach

Anticipating that Commissioners would appreciate time to study and digest the materials, staff invites initial questions and comments on the above items on January 13 and will return to the Commission on January 27 for additional discussion.

### **VISION, PRINCIPLES, AND STRATEGIES**

The TMP is organized around a vision statement, principles that guide plan implementation, and strategies that support and advance the vision. Staff introduced both the framework and the TMP document at the Planning Commission's August 2020 briefing. Since then, staff has solicited input from the community on updates to the vision, guiding principles, and strategies and is now seeking input from the Planning Commission on January 13 and January 27. The

vision, guiding principles, and strategies are provided as Attachment A, and community input is summarized in Attachment C.

## **POLICY CONSIDERATIONS**

One key question arising from the effort to update the vision, principles, and strategies is: what policies should the City consider when updating the TMP? To help the City begin answering this question, staff developed an initial set of policy considerations. These draft considerations align with the five guiding principles and are organized by the four strategies. In December, staff solicited input on the draft considerations from the Redmond 2050 Community Advisory Committee (CAC). The draft policy considerations and input from the CAC are provided in Attachment B.

## **PUBLIC INPUT SUMMARY**

Staff conducted an online questionnaire to gather input from the community on the vision, principles, and strategies. The questionnaire was issued via the City's Let's Connect platform (live from November 9 to December 13, 2020), accessible from the Redmond 2050 Virtual Lobby, and promoted on the City's social media. The questionnaire was paired with an on-line, interactive map tool, which solicited ideas from the public about transportation projects or problem areas for consideration during the TMP Update. There were 108 responses to the questionnaire, which included both multiple choice and open-ended questions. One hundred six (106) responses were submitted to the on-line map, with projects or problem areas identified in every Redmond neighborhood. Staff continues to analyze the results of public outreach. An initial, high-level summary of the findings is provided in Attachment C. This summary will be updated as analysis continues.
