



Right now way too many people, including myself and our family drive (SOV) because there's no easy, convenient street car that would get us from our neighborhood to downtown Redmond. To improve air quality, and reduce noise pollution, the best option is to introduce a Redmond Streetcar (inline with cars and lanes) from each of the key neighborhoods to downtown so that less cars will be driving and causing traffic jams in downtown Redmond. Plus we need to encourage shopping and activities without driving into the downtown as wells as give people a way to get to the Transit Centers. Also, with streetcars, LWSD could reduce or eliminate busing kids because they would be able to get to school on public transportation. This is one of the biggest expenses by the school district and causes difficulty with school start times. High school students in neighboring districts already use public transport but Redmond is woefully behind on this. Ideally these streetcars wouldn't take 50 years to buy, install and begin operation like the light rail. In Germany, streetcars are so handy and move a lot of people around locally, eliminating the need for large parking structures in downtown areas but getting many people into the center for markets, shopping, appointments, regional transit, etc.
