REDMOND 2050 COMMUNITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING

Thursday, September 9, 2021

6:00 - 8:00 p.m.

1. CAC Social Time

CAC members and staff met on the back deck of City Hall for conversation and refreshments.

2. Call to Order

Chair Joffre called the meeting to order at 6:54 p.m.

3. Approval of Meeting Summary for September 9, 2021

Approved without objection.

4. Parks, Arts, Recreation, Conservation, and Culture (PARCC) Element Required Updates

Mr. Aken introduced the required updates for the PARCC Element and described the relationship between the PARCC Element and the PARCC Plan.

Committee Questions and Comments

- Will the PARCC work include just existing parks or also new parks?
 - Staff response: both, especially in Overlake where significant growth will be accommodated. There will be consideration of a future community center in Overlake. In addition, there is a need for parks and open spaces in Marymoor Village. Part of the plan update process will be asking: what do you we need?
- What consideration will there be for providing the kinds of amenities and services typical of community parks closer to the urban centers?
 - Staff response: space requirements will be a challenge. The City will work with partners like the school district and will look at existing facilities to understand what is limiting activities (lighting, turfing, court striping, etc.). Park planning model is moving away from acres per person and toward "are we serving the community?" Parks meets quarterly with LWSD on partnership opportunity and also has conversations with Microsoft about the potential use of some of its open spaces.
- Consider places that are like Redmond in the plan update

5. Other Element Updates

Mr. Churchill described the scope and process for updating policies related to Phase 1 topics (housing, economic vitality, transportation, parks, and Overlake) that are found in Phase 2 elements.

Committee Questions and Comments

- How can Redmond avoid or minimize this exercise in the future?
 - Staff response: having topics appear in multiple elements cannot be entirely avoided. Reducing the number of overall policies - which is one expected outcome of the plan update - will help.
