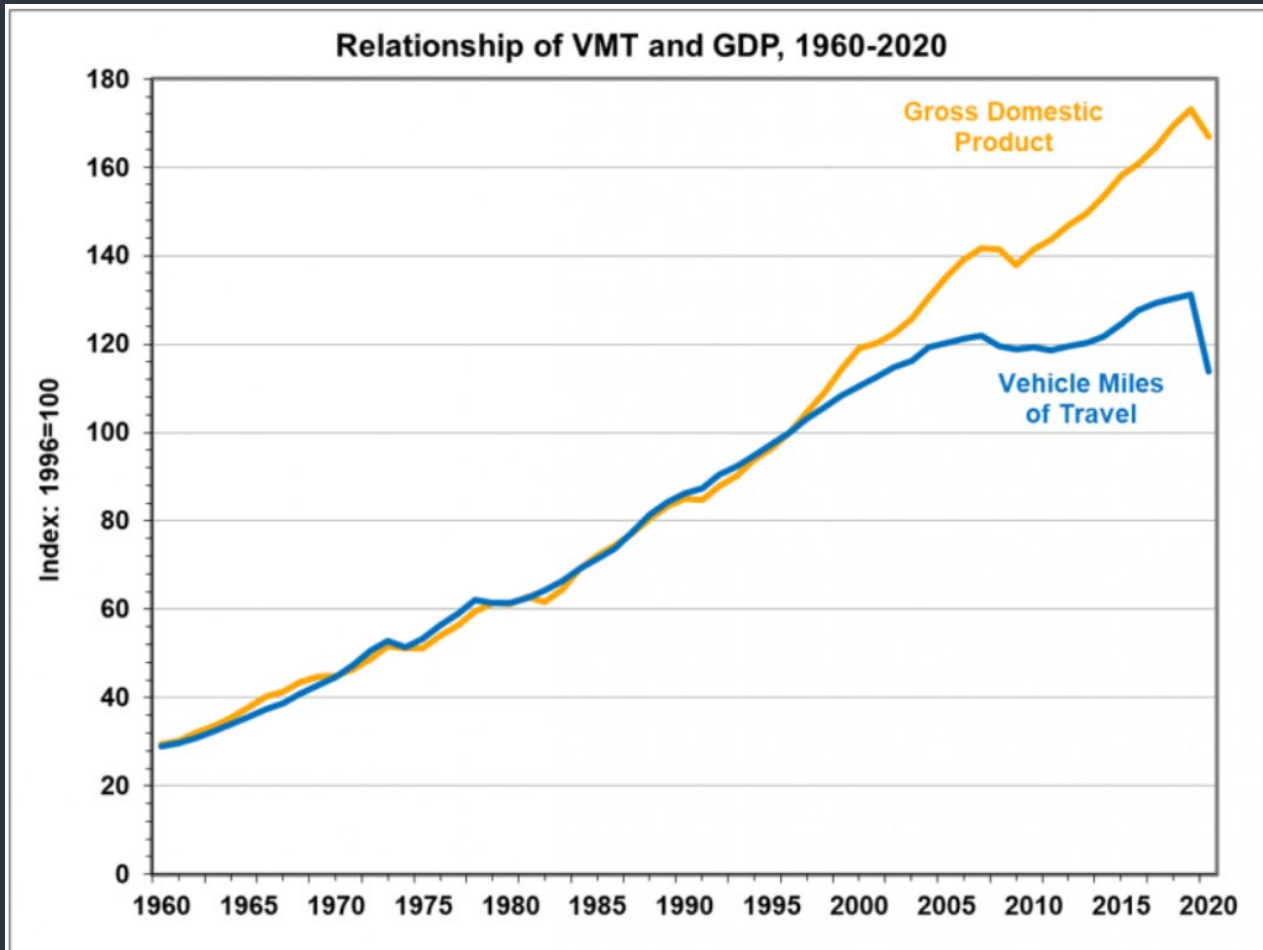

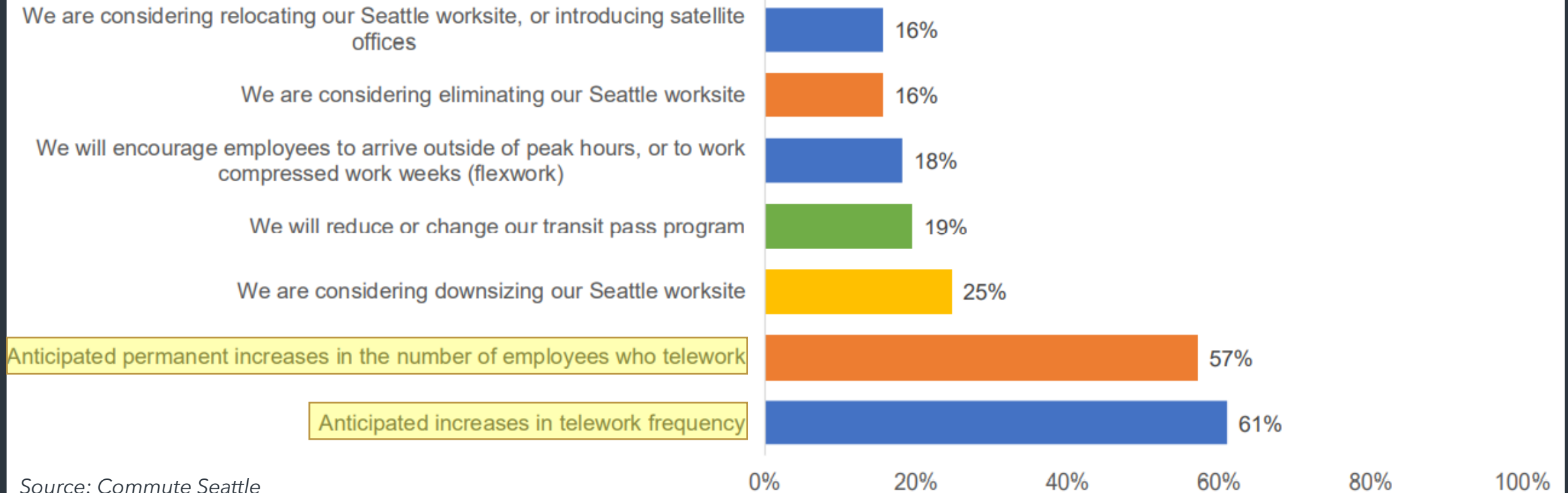

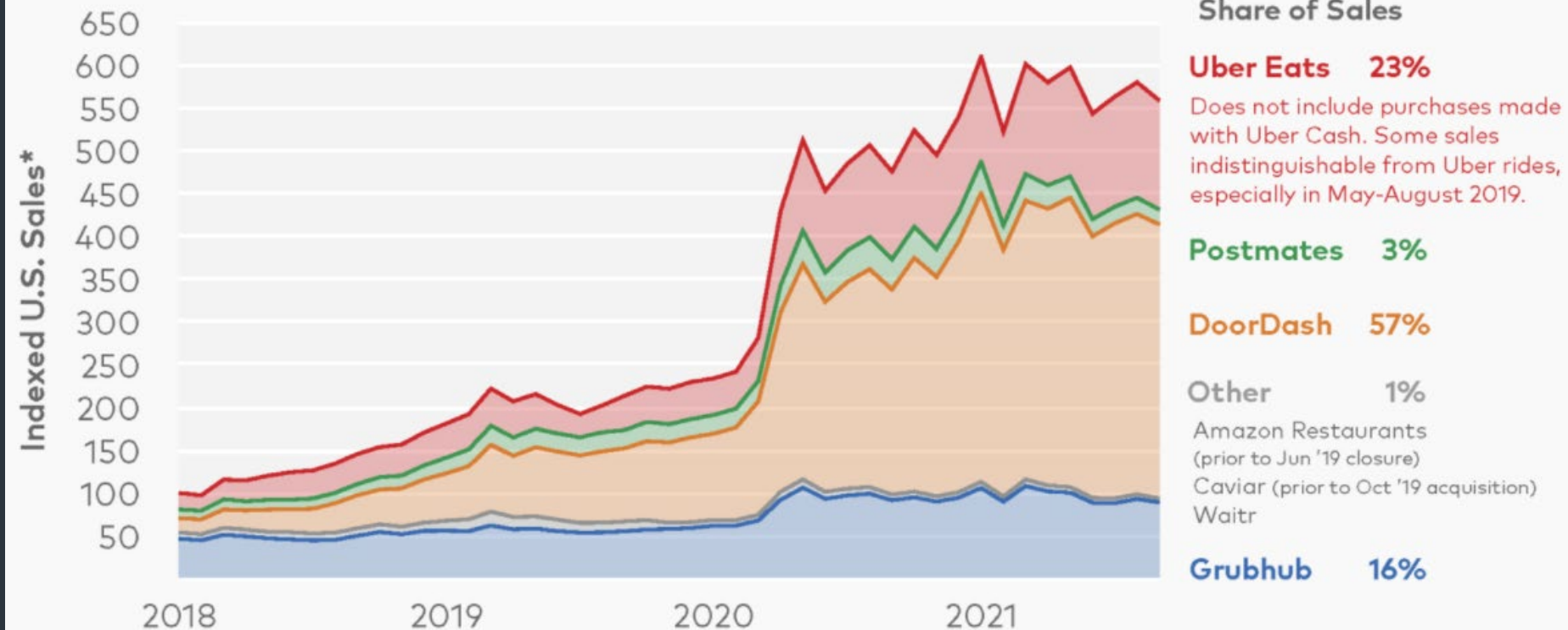
Anticipated long-term impacts of COVID-19 on transportation benefits:

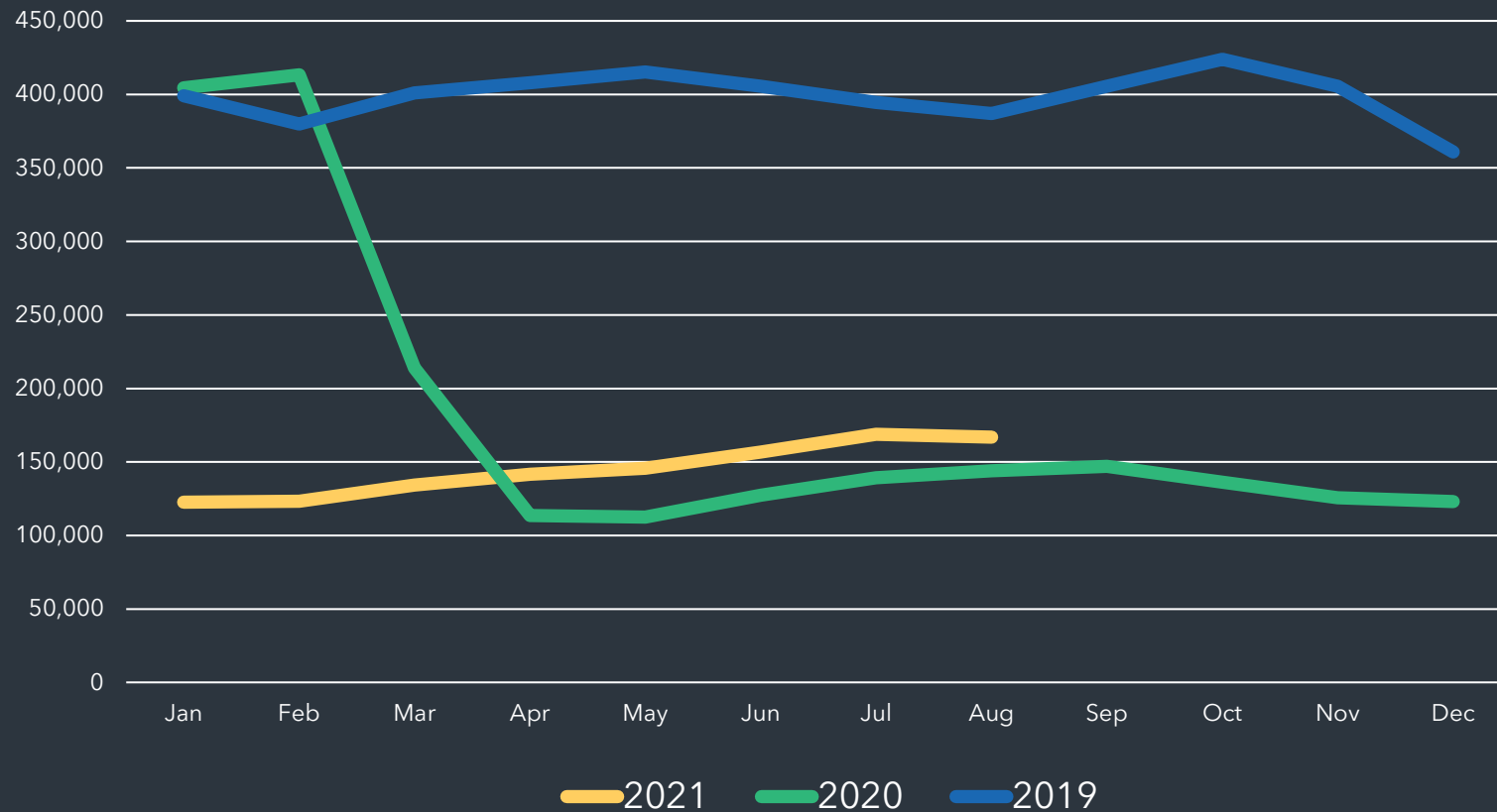
Meal Delivery - Monthly Sales

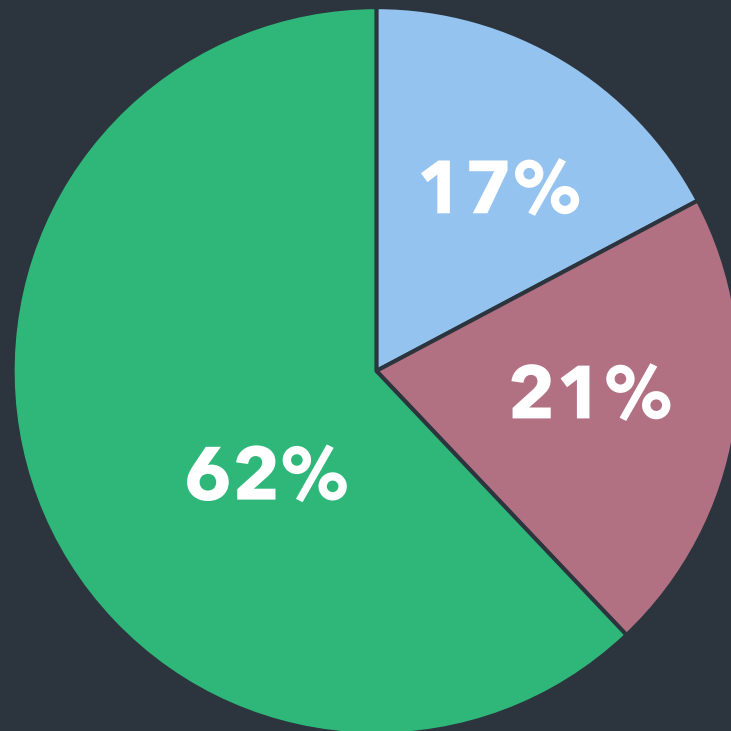

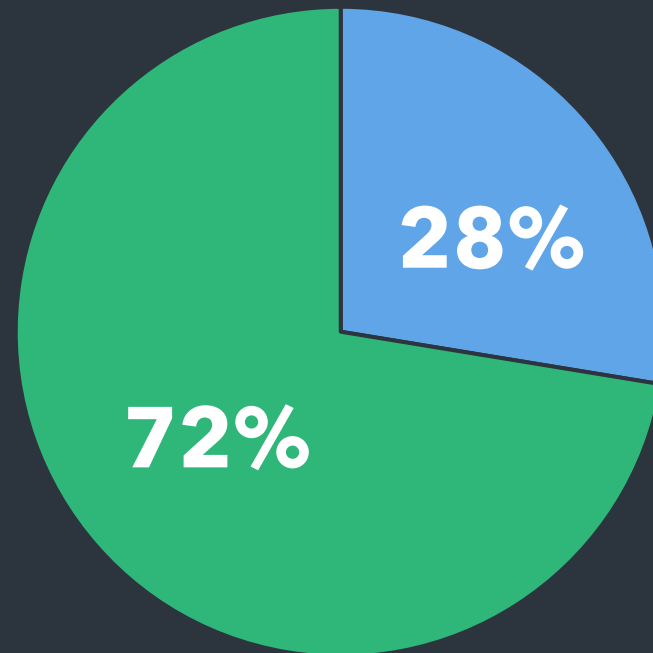
Policy Consideration: Maximizing TOD

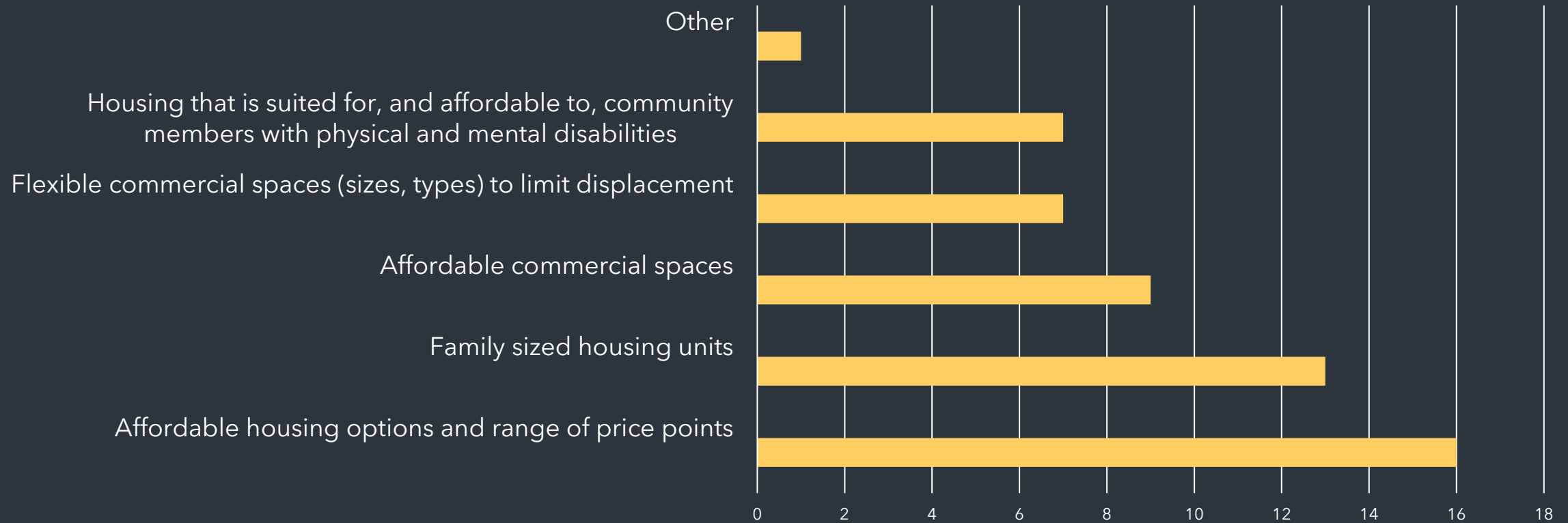
Policy Consideration: Consolidate Land Use Categories

- 2 - Combine Employment & Overlake Village subareas

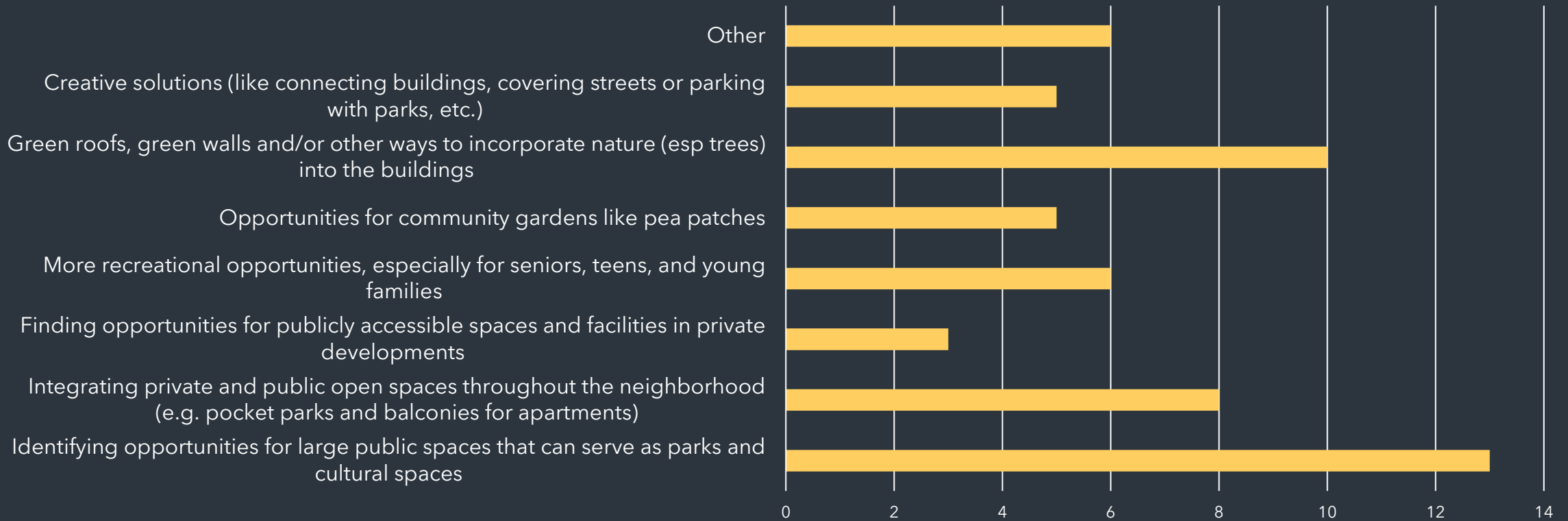

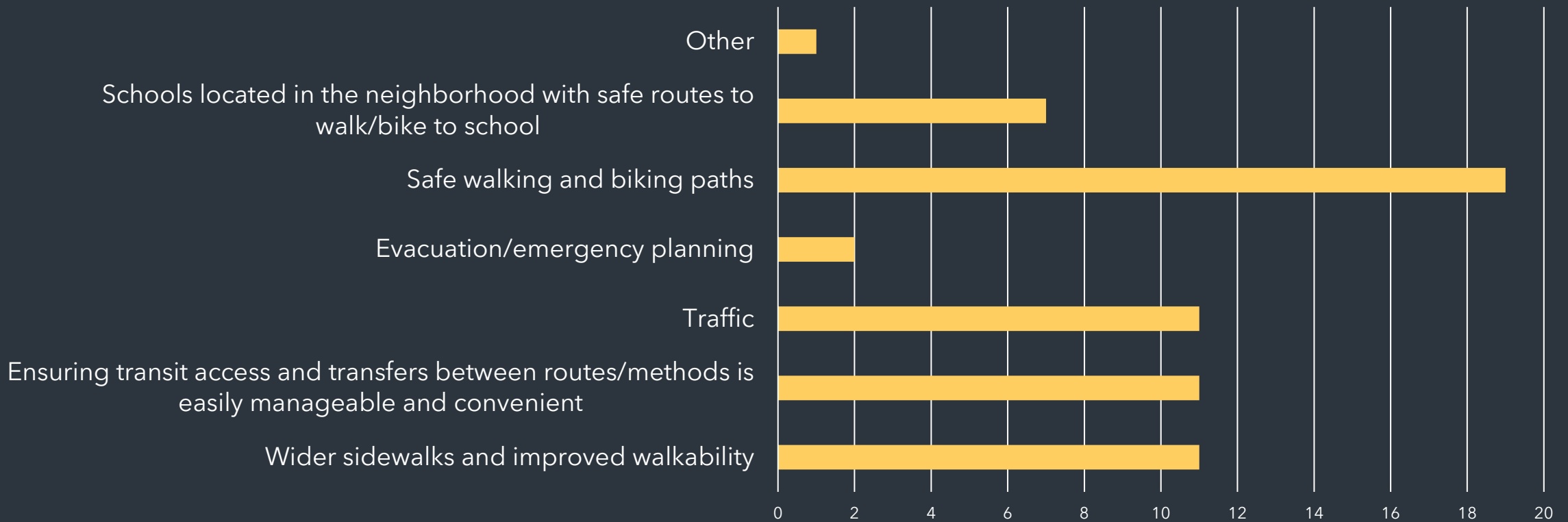
