## City of Redmond Stewardship Highlights: 2022

### Adopt-a-Drain ([www.adopt-a-drain.org/wa](http://www.adopt-a-drain.org/wa))

The City promotes the Adopt-a-Drain program in partnership with six neighbors. This program asks residents to adopt a storm drain in their neighborhood and keep it clear of leaves, trash, and other debris to reduce water pollution and help prevent localized flooding. The City promoted this program through its webpage (see: <https://www.redmond.gov/1225/Taking-Action>), social media (Facebook and Instagram accounts), Summer FOCUS newsletter, senior newsletter, video readerboard in City Hall lobby, and e-news blasts. To date, almost 150 Redmond community members have adopted 239 storm drains in their neighborhoods.



### Green Redmond Partnership

The City of Redmond works through the Green Redmond Partnership and other partners to build a sustainable network of healthy urban green spaces for the benefit and enjoyment of our entire city. Green Redmond Partnership, along with its major partner, Forterra, is committed to restoring all 1,035 acres of Redmond's forested parkland into active management. To accomplish this mission requires the dedication and hard work of many volunteers.

In 2022, Green Redmond Partnership sponsored almost 100 work parties and community events. Most of these events were focused on removing invasive plants and planting native plants. In all, more than 600 individuals contributed over 2,500 hours of time in support of Redmond's watershed restoration efforts.
