T & D Feeds



For 75 years this familiar landmark towered over lesser structures in Redmond's historic downtown, a forthright symbol of our community's agrarian past. The original retail store opened in 1918 on a site to the west of the present building, and was moved nearer the railway tracks in the 1930s. When it closed in 2000, it was still serving small farmers and ranchers on the outskirts of town. The store, feed mill and warehouse complex operated under a succession of names over the years including the Grange Co-op, Western Farmers, Nordquist Feed Mills, and lastly, T & D Feeds. The structures on this site were demolished in the spring of 2001.
